Board Summary

Dear PSCA Members,

As I reflect on the past year, I am filled with pride and gratitude for the remarkable progress our Association has made. Serving as the Chair of the Board of Directors has been a truly rewarding experience, and I am thrilled to continue in this role for the upcoming year!

This past year, we have achieved significant milestones that underscore our commitment to excellence in governance:

- Upholding and Sustaining Excellence in Governance: We undertook a comprehensive overhaul of our Association's Bylaws, which included reducing the size of the board over the course of the next 3 years, ultimately having 9 directors by the year 2027. In addition, the Board passed two complete policy manual updates and 13 individual policy edits, while also passing 22 new procedures and an entire procedure manual, reinforcing our commitment to effective governance. Leadership opportunities amongst the board have also been shared, giving everyone an equal voice, in addition to fully eliminating an "executive board" from within.
- **Achievement of Board Goals:** We proudly completed 100% of the board goals outlined in our newly created Annual Agenda, addressing all 69 items identified during our Leadership Development Academy.
- **Enhancing Onboarding and Mentoring:** We introduced an exit survey for departing board directors to assess and refine our onboarding and mentoring processes, ensuring a smooth transition and continued excellence.

- Revised Policies and Procedures: We revised the Ends Policy monitoring calendar and created new parliamentary procedures, along with a Committee Terms of Reference agreement to guide operational and board collaboration.
- **Strategic Initiatives and Engagement:** We organized 12 task forces to address various board responsibilities, launched our first Emerging Leaders Program, and began discussions on revising our Ends Policies. Our first cohort of graduate ambassadors engaged with us during meetings and committee work, contributing fresh perspectives and energy!
- **Commitment to Transparency and Accountability:** We implemented new systems for transparency and accountability, completed an Annual Review to ensure adherence to our policies, and shared leadership opportunities across the board.
- Successful Elections and Development: We held successful board and chair/assistant chair elections, renewed our executive director's contract, and received ongoing consultation and professional development on policy governance. We also developed a procedural framework to guide our current and future secretaries in their roles.

As we move forward, I am excited about the opportunities that lie ahead and am confident that our collective efforts will continue to drive positive change for our members. I look forward to working together to build on our achievements and tackle new challenges with the same dedication and enthusiasm that have defined our work this past year!

This virtual summit gathered school-based and community mental health professionals, youth, policy-makers, and other vested partners to dialogue, share and lead in addressing Pennsylvania's growing mental health crisis, through awareness and cross-systems partnership and tiered supports.

Through a series of panels and rollout videos, the Summit identified key areas of policy reform, effective practices, and networks of support for students in and beyond the walls of school and across a lifetime. Dr. Dana Milakovic serves as the Mental Wellness and Trauma Specialist for the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE), as well as the lead for the Social Emotional Wellness State System of Support. Dr. Milakovic is a mental health and trauma specialist with experience in school mental health, community mental health, pediatric neuropsychology, school administration, and school psychology. In her current role, she is focused on strengthening schools by applying neuropsychological research to mental health integration in schools, trauma-informed schools, school climate, substance use disorders, and improving mental wellness for students and school staff across Pennsylvania. Prior to her work at PDE, Dr. Milakovic spent over 17 years working on behalf of youth with special needs as a community mental health evaluator, school psychologist, and administrator.



Perri Rosen, PhD, NCSP, is a consulting psychologist at the Pennsylvania Office of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services (OMHSAS) at the Department of Human Services (DHS) in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. She is also Pennsylvania licensed psychologist, Nationally Certified School Psychologist (NCSP), and a Pennsylvania certified special educator. At DHS-OMHSAS, Dr. Rosen has helped lead several youth mental health and suicide prevention initiatives, many of which have focused on schools and cross-systems collaboration.

Conference Attendance was 278 in person and Kalahari in the Poconos and 67 attendees were virtual. PSCA's Annual Conference: It's all about belonging!

Our 68th Annual Conference was held at the beautiful Kalahari Resort in the Poconos! The theme began with "Building Belonging" in pre-conference and led to "Being and Belonging" at conference. This year's conference was not only held in person, but offered a virtual option as well. There was much excitement in the air as we gathered for quality professional development, networking opportunities, and a much-needed respite.

We kicked off with our pre-conference, which was held on Wednesday, December 6, 2023. The topic of the pre-conference was an Equity Summit, which addressed the equity and access challenges encountered by students in our schools and offered several strategies to combat this growing problem. PSCA brought together not only school counselors, but school librarians, school psychologists, behavioral healthcare professionals, legislators and many others to share their resources and knowledge in supporting student attendance. The highlight was hearing from the Leadership and Diversity Committee at Wallenpaupack High School. These students shared their stories of working to build awareness of different cultures and acceptance for all students within their school community. We were honored to have Dr. Nikole Hollins-Sims deliver the keynote address, "A Dream is a Wish Your Heart Makes". It's our hope that our continued partnership with other student support professionals will help to increase awareness and student outcomes in the areas of equity, inclusion, and belonging.

Day 1 of the conference on December 7th kicked off with a welcome from PSCA Board Chair Larissa Valonis, followed by an introduction of the Board of Directors. Then, our Keynote speaker, Dee-1, energized the crowd with his positive message of belonging within his family and community. He even got conference attendees to rap along with him on a few of his songs. Afterwards, participants were able to engage in workshops that included advocacy, ethics, evaluations, career development, and self-care as well as the chance to observe eight graduate student poster sessions.

In addition, several outstanding school counselors and affiliates were honored at the Recognition Luncheon. Among those who were recognized was PSCA's School Counselor of the Year, Ms, Kelsey Davis. Other recognitions went to Dr. Richard Joseph Behun from Millersville University for School Counselor Educator of the Year, Dr. Megan Luft from Shippensburg University for Advocate of the Year, Helen Gym as the Legislator of the Year, and Ms. Maria Miller, Administrator of the Year. In addition, Madelyn Reilly was awarded the Bill Lee Leadership Grant as a first-time attendee of a PSCA conference. Also, two schools were the first to achieve

Plus, a special shout out went to Mrs. Carley Czegan for receiving the designation as an ASCA certified school counselor. Congratulations to all of our award winners! Finally, we honored the service of outgoing Board Directors Dr. Adam Oldham and Michelle Strasser. Thank you both for your dedication and hard work to PSCA!! Thursday evening capped off with a visit to our exhibit hall for a "Fun Night" sponsored by Smart Futures where attendees could network and play bingo to win some great prizes. PSCA was proud to have over 60 exhibitors in the exhibit hall and to have three platinum and one gold sponsor of our conference! Those sponsors were The Milton Hershey School, the Eastern Atlantic States Regional Council of Carpenters, Smart Futures, and Shippensburg University. We wish to thank them and all of the sponsors for their generous support of PSCA and the school counseling profession.

The final day of the conference brought Keynote speaker Dr. Rebecca Pianta to speak to conference attendees. She talked about the importance of using data to make sure students belong where their talents are. She encouraged school counselors to analyze data and advocate for the needs of our students. Other notable workshops on Friday focused on becoming a culturally competent school counselor, executive functioning skills, gender support plans, universal screenings, emerging leaders, and the new PA Diamond Recognition program.

Keynote Session and Workshops

Laura Fridirici, Career Readiness Advisor at PDE, will share the newly proposed revisions to the Career Education and Work (CEW) Standards. As the standards move through the regulatory review process, what can school counselors do to prepare for implementation in July 2026? What will these revisions mean to school counselors and the students we serve? What are schools doing now that aligns to the upcoming standards? The new standard of Employability Skills is an area of alignment and essential for career and life readiness. We thank Laura for her time during this educational session on CEW Standards. Additionally, workshops were held after the Keynote. The workshops were on Trauma and Crisis, Evidence Based Practices, Post Secondary Readiness and DEI & School Climate.

Legislative Update

The Pennsylvania School Counseling Services Act had significant movement in SY 23-24. The bill was reintroduced as HB 1665 in September 2023, it was discussed at a hearing of the House Education Committee in January 2024, and then it passed out of the House Education Committee on January 18, 2024. On March 25, 2024, HB 1665 passed the Pennsylvania House of Representatives, and it was sent over to the Pennsylvania Senate on April 4, 2024. PSCA engaged with lawmakers on both sides of the aisle, as well as school administrators and PDE, to introduce a Senate version of the School Counseling Services Act (SB 33) on June 7, 2024. On June 25, 2024 almost 100 school counselors visited the Pennsylvania Capitol to advocate for HB 1665 and SB 33, where they participated in a press event on the Capitol steps with lawmakers from both the House and the Senate, PSEA

President Aaron Chapin, school counselor educators, and past school counselors of the year. Attendees visited every Senate office and dropped off material about HB 1665 and SB 33, and several groups were able to meet with their Senator or their staff.

HB 1665 and SB 33 both currently sit in the hands of the Senate Education Committee. PSCA will continue to engage with the General Assembly to push this legislation across the finish line and ensure all Pennsylvania students have access to school counseling services provided by certified school counselors.



PA has developed its own version of the RAMP designation called the "PA Diamond Recognition".

We've created a PA application in the same portal that ASCA uses.

What are the advantages of doing this?

If you or an additional applicant holds dual membership with ASCA and PSCA, the application fee will be paid for you by PSCA.

If your school is deemed to have achieved the PA Diamond Recognition, your application will automatically be forwarded to ASCA and will also achieve RAMP with no additional work needed by you.

Keep in mind that the PA Diamond Recognition applicant has two extra sections specific to the CEW Standards. These sections will be included in the RAMP Camp Training videos on the "Members Only Section"
